# Safety Notice

Due to the recent incident that occurred in NSW where an aluminium alloy cylinder exploded whilst being filled, safety alerts have been issued regarding certain aluminium cylinders.

Dive Jervis Bay will be adhering to the following policy based on the information provided by Workplace Health and Safety Queensland.

At risk SCUBA cylinders manufactured from aluminium alloy 6351 include:

- **Luxfer aluminium alloy cylinders manufactured between 1972 and 1988 (check oldest hydrostatic test date stamp)**
- **Luxfer aluminium alloy cylinder specification DOT SP6498**
- **Luxfer aluminium alloy cylinder specification DOT E6498, E7042, E8107, E8364, E8422**
- **CIG (Australia) aluminium alloy manufactured in or before 1990 (check hydrostatic test date stamp)**

**THESE TANKS WILL NOT BE FILLED BY DIVE JERVIS BAY UNLESS THEY HAVE BEEN EDDY CURRENT TESTED (VISUAL PLUS) IN ADDITION TO NORMAL HYDROSTATIC TESTING AND VISUAL INSPECTION.**

So please do not be offended if we refuse to fill your tank.
